


3/4M INCURSION



On the 25/8/2017 3/4M entered the Art room for an exciting incursion for Mad about Science. Firstly we sorted three bottles with either solids, liquids or gases into groups of solids, liquids and gases.

Then Miss K placed a little bit of dry ice on a platter and a little bit of normal ice on the same sized platter. The normal ice formed into a water and a puddle and the dry ice formed into gas with no puddle.

Miss K then told us to get into groups of four. In my group there was Leni, Cooper, Patrick and I. In the groups of four Miss K placed a tube with water in it.



Cooper then dropped in three drops of red food colouring. I then dropped in some dishwashing liquid. Mrs. Macca placed in lots of dishwashing liquid in our tube to see what would happen. Miss K then placed in some dry ice and a bubbly, slippery snake came out. The snake felt really weird but cool. The snake poured out like lava coming out of a volcano.

3/4M then all came to the floor to explain what had happened to their snake and what it looked like.

Miss K then placed some dry ice into a plastic zip lock bag. The bag suddenly started to inflate. Miss K predicted that the bag would inflate and after a while pop

and make a big bang.




The whole class then started to play a game. The game was what gas is that? There were 3 rules to play the game. Those rules were if the flame goes out it is made of carbon dioxide. If the flame stays the same the gas is nitrogen and if the flame gets bigger the gas is oxygen. First Miss K gave us another tube that she poured some water into. Miss K then lit a candle and placed it into a beaker that was then placed into the tube. Miss K then carefully placed a candle into the tube and dropped some dry ice into the tube. Dry ice is made from carbon dioxide. Carbon dioxide's scientific name is CO₂.

'For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory of his Father with his angels, and, when he does, he will reward each one according to his behaviour.'




