

## New guidance on face masks

Following the Government's announcements regarding new state-wide restrictions that came into effect at 11:59pm on Wednesday 3 February, there is new guidance for schools regarding the wearing of masks. People aged 12 and over must wear a fitted face mask when in public indoor spaces unless there is a lawful reason not to.

Students aged 12 or older must wear a face mask indoors when at school, unless they are attending a primary school, an Outside school hours care (OHSC) program or an exception applies.


Children under 12 years of age and students at primary school or attending an OHSC program are not required to wear face masks.

School staff are not required to wear face masks while teaching or caring, but those who wish to do so, can. Staff must wear face masks in indoor areas of the school when not teaching or caring.

Visitors to school sites must also wear masks when indoors.

We need to remain vigilant. We ask that you continue to practice social distancing and not enter the classrooms. Thank you for your continued understanding.

## MACS Governance



This year marks a new era for Catholic education, as 290 schools from across the Archdiocese of Melbourne have come together with the staff at James Goold

House and the regional offices to form Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS). I will now refer to our governing body as MACS in our newsletters.

Together with us MACS will work to achieve the mission of Catholic education, which is to proclaim the Good News and equip our young people with the knowledge, skills and hope to live meaningful lives and enrich the world around them.

On a local level our school has not changed and we will continue to lead the delivery of high-quality teaching that facilitates excellent learning outcomes for students and to work in partnership with parents, and parish priests who remain the custodians of mission in our communities.

However, the new governance arrangements will represent what we hope are positive changes for all of us as MACS. Processes, policies, procedures and ways of working together will be centralised under this updated governance system. Further guidance on these matters and others will be forthcoming in the weeks and months ahead.

Many of the senior leaders and regional staff of MACS will work with us as we complete this program of work.



## Covid Safe Guide

We continue to follow the following Covid-19 safe protocols to ensure we keep our school environment free from the spread of coronavirus.

- Remain at least 1.5 metres from other individuals and wherever possible, follow the “one person per 4 square metres” rule.
- Only have one person in small work areas.
- Avoid shaking hands, hugging or touching others.
- Avoid large gatherings indoors.
- Always use good hand and cough/sneeze hygiene.
- Don’t share food or drinks in the workplace.
- Practise the recommended hygiene and cleaning protocols.



- Visitors, contractors and delivery drivers need to follow sign-in, physical distancing, hygiene and cleaning protocols.
- Staff and visitors are being reminded to remain hyper vigilant in maintaining good personal hygiene, at all times.
- We keep a record of all staff, students and visitors who attend on-site for more than 15 minutes.
- We record the name, contact details, date, and time of attendance at school, as well as the areas of the school that the person attended.
- The sign-in process includes reference to maintaining the confidentiality of records in accordance with the *Privacy and Data Protection Act 2014* (Vic.).


Upon arrival at the school/office all visitors, contractors, staff and students are being asked to confirm that they have not:

- Experienced fever or flu-like symptoms, such as coughing, sore throat and fatigue.
- Experienced shortness of breath.
- Been in close contact with someone who has returned from overseas or a covid-19 hotspot, in the last 14 days.
- Been in close contact with someone with a confirmed case of covid-19

### Literacy Testing

Thank you for bringing your children in for their formal pre- testing in Literacy. Our teachers found great benefit in having this uninterrupted time to gain an accurate measure of where to start the year with your child in terms of their Literacy learning and they also valued this 1-1 time to build on their rapport with each of their students for 2021. We hope that your children also enjoyed this opportunity to spend time with their teacher and ease into the New Year.



### Be Sunsmart: Apply Sunscreen

During term one and term four we ask that our children apply sunscreen before they come to school. Each class also has a supply of sunscreen which is reapplied before going out to lunch. Children need also to wear their St Ambrose sunhat when outdoors. Your child may also bring their own sunscreen from home if you prefer a particular brand or if your child has skin allergies. 


