

Drop Off & Pick Up Points

Children can leave their bags outside their classroom doors when they arrive in the mornings from Monday onwards. Years 3-4O, 3-4L, 1-2R, 1-2RL and our Prep class can now enter the school in the mornings from Urquhart Street if they wish. The front of the school will remain fenced off until the second stage of the works are complete.

CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE PROGRAM



The Conveyance Allowance Program is a form of financial assistance to help families in rural and regional Victoria with the cost of transporting their children to their nearest appropriate school/campus. The conveyance allowance is available to eligible students travelling by public transport, private car and private bus. The conveyance allowance is also available to eligible students whose nearest school is not serviced by a free school bus.

Eligibility Criteria

The eligibility criteria varies depending on the type of school attended and where it is located. Students attending a government or non-government school must:

- Attend their nearest government or non-government school/campus appropriate to their year level at which admission is permissible.
- Be enrolled at a school/campus outside Melbourne's metropolitan conveyance boundary.
- Reside 4.8km or more by the shortest practicable route from that school/campus attended.
- Be of school age (5 to 18 years old at time of application) and reside in Victoria.

If you believe you are eligible, please collect a form from the school office. If you completed a form in a previous year, you do NOT need to fill in another one. Any questions, please speak to Karen at the school office.


