



The people that scores these tests don't know that some of you love to sing, are good at drawing or can teach others how to use a computer program. They have not seen the way that some of you can dance with grace or speak confidently to a large group. They do not know that your friends count on you to be there for them when they are sad. They do not know that you participate in sports, help your Mum or Dad or play with your little brother, sister or cousins. They do not know that you are caring, thoughtful and that every day you do your best. These attributes cannot be tested. The scores you get from this test will tell you how you did on that day, but they will not tell you everything. They can't tell you that you have improved on something that you once found difficult. They can't tell you that you brighten up your teacher's day. They can't tell you how

amazingly special you are.





A big thank you to the Woodend CWA for their \$100 donation to our School Library.









Smiling Mind's psychologists developed the program through extensive consultation with children and their parents. It's led by evidence and created to fit into everyday family life. Featuring a variety of modules—each packed with bite-sized activities—the Resilient Families Program is designed to bring families together through the development of a common language. It seeks to help kids develop key social and emotional skills and equips parents and carers with the tools to support them to build their mental fitness.
