Find what works for you and your family -Dr. Matt Sanders (Positive Parenting Program) suggests trying to spend small amounts of time with your child- even as little as one or two minutes- frequently throughout the day. The time that is special to your child might be when they approach to tell you something, show you something important, ask a question, or involve you in their activity. When these moments occur and you are not occupied with something important, try to stop what you are doing and be present with your child for just a short time. It takes a bit of practice to really tune in but it can really be powerful in developing positive relationships with your child. (This strategy also works for partners/family/friends and work colleagues

### **Anslow St Entry**

·Receiving and managing the correspondence. ·Obtaining reports from sub-committees.


·Writing up the minutes.






# Student Representative Council

















1/2 Raco's refined, radiant, and receptive roommates have been super busy this week! Our week has been filled with learning.

# Explain The "Tolerance Cup" To Your Child:

When your cup overflows, strong emotions come out of your body, which can get messy!

When our big emotions come out, our cup gets emptied again. That's a good thing.


SOME WAYS TO POUR WATER OUT OF YOUR TOLERANCE CUP:
