## **Message from** the Principal


#### Dear families, parishioners, and friends,

## Focussed Teaching at St Ambrose



In order for our teachers to meet the varied learning needs in their classrooms we follow a whole-small-whole approach as appropriate across all areas of the curriculum in particular when we are teaching reading, writing, and mathematics. Each class will start with a whole class lesson focus before students will work from their point of need in smaller groups or independently. The teaching groups are fluid depending on what is being taught. Small groups might include:

skill/strategy lessons in reading/writing/maths

 shared reading/writing
 phonics review
 guided reading
 reteaching/pre-teaching/enrichment (any subject)
 language development

Small groups are commonly seen in reading, but small-group instruction is useful in all curriculum areas. The nature of a small group lends itself to a smaller student-teacher ratio allowing for students to share responses more frequently than in large-group settings. Teachers can use this time to gauge understanding, provide timely feedback, take anecdotal notes, and build stronger relationships with students.

In short focus teaching sessions:

 allows for increased collaboration amongst students. Students can have their say and gain clarification when they have wonderings.
 enables individualized instruction on a smaller scale.

increases student engagement.
 allows for personalised feedback.
 boosts self-confidence.
 the teacher is able to target the lesson from the student's point of need.

#### **Building Update**



#### WONDERING....


#### "Wonder and Awe in God's Presence"


