Naplan Results

Our year 5 students' families will have received their Naplan results today. Year 3 students' results will be sent home on Monday. We congratulate our students who overall performed strongly across the areas assessed via this platform.

Our results indicated that we are:
-above the state average in Yr. 3 reading, conventions of language & numeracy.

-at the higher end of the State average for reading and numeracy in Yr. 5 and above average for Language Conventions.

We are yet to hear what the national average is.

We will examine our results thoroughly in the coming weeks which will inform our planning.

Wellbeing for Learning



This year we will be having our book week parade on **Monday**, **August 28th at 9.00 am** on the hardcourts.





Dear Families,

Welcome back to the start of Term 3. We hope that you have had an enjoyable and restful break with your families. Once again it promises to be another busy term both in and out of the classroom. The students have all settled well into their classes and we are really looking forward to our learning journey together in Semester 2.

We have wasted no time starting our learning journey. Our Inquiry Unit this Term is a Science Unit called 'Journey to Discover!" We will learn about light refraction, electrical circuits, states of matter, and the scale of the solar system through hands-on experiments and experiences. We will build a thermoscope, a paper circuit and a balloon-powered rocket. We will work towards creating a presentation and a quiz to highlight the wondrous facts that they have learnt during the unit.





Lots of learning has already been happening during maths. Our major focus so far this term has been Factors and Multiples. My mathematicians have already shown excellent progress in this short time and are ready to tackle multiplication and division!

During writing, we have been learning about the genre 'Narrative Text.' We have been exploring text structure and language features including adjectives, Nouns, past tense verbs, adverbs, onomatopoeia, saying verbs and direct speech. Next week we begin looking at 'Orientation Phase?' Stay tuned families, hopefully, you will see some of this

learning through the newsletter articles my people write throughout the Semester!

Our provocation for Religion is 'Who is Jesus?' We will explore who Jesus is and how He portrays himself in the Bible. We will investigate and reflect on the 3 of the 'I am' statements found in John's gospel. Students will identify and reflect on how the words of Jesus help them to understand how they can know Him.

Finally, yesterday our senior area had the privilege of working with award-winning novelist and educator Ingrid Laguno. The workshop was centred around the orientation of a narrative (setting the scene and characterisation).

She taught us about writing techniques, character development and setting the scene. We did a writing activity that for your first draft you have to let the words flow onto the page. She taught us to describe the characters feelings not just tell them. She also taught us to take on feedback as a positive and to edit thoroughly.




Over the next few weeks the students will be exploring what areas of their learning they may want to improve and what growth mindsets could support them in that.
