## Message from the Principal

Dear families, parishioners, and friends, St. Ambrose, like all schools must participate in a school review every four years. The school review informs the development of the school's four-year School Strategic Plan.
The school review also provides assurance of ongoing compliance with the Minimum Standards related to curriculum and student safety and learning. This week our reviewer checked that we are compliant with the VRQA standards. On Monday and Tuesday, he will be in our school speaking with staff, students, and parents to gain further insights into where we are at in terms of our five spheres of school improvement. We spent time as a whole staff last Friday evaluating our progress with the Teaching and Learning as well as the Religious Education Spheres. We have also reflected on our successes with School Community, Leadership, and Management as well as the Well-being sphere. Our reviewer will look at our evaluations and evidence also to support us to plan for the next four-year period.
This process has prompted me to contemplate.
While school life is something we all have in common, we all form different understandings of what an effective day at school might look like. For some, school is hard and for others, it's a breeze. For some of us school is a social gathering while for others it can be daunting to negotiate our way around each day. Regardless of our experiences, I hope that our school is a place of welcome and acceptance for all. Our staff works hard every day to build an environment where learning is fostered whether it be academic, social, emotional, spiritual, or physical. Every child counts in our school and every child helps to build the community of St. Ambrose. I wonder what your memories of primary school are? Things have certainly changed since I was a student! Just like when we were at school, every day brings its challenges and its celebrations. So even when the going gets tough, let's remember that we are all working together to build a positive and supportive learning environment for everyone.

## Punctuality

It is delightful to feel the enthusiasm of your children as they arrive at school each morning. Children are supervised from 8.30 am until 3.45 pm . We ask that you drop off and pick up within these times when supervision is available. Students should arrive by 8.55 am . School finishes at 3.30 pm which is pick
up time. A reminder to walk bikes along the front path during peak times.

## Late Arrival \& Early Pick Up Procedures

We ask that you please notify the school via Operoo of any planned student late arrivals, early departures or absences. You may also email the teacher directly if you need to provide any further details.
You can access an "Absence Explanation Notice" in Operoo by selecting the "Form Library" tab on the purple task bar. When dropping your child off late, a parent must sign the child in on the iPad at the front office and hand the child a green late pass to pass onto their teacher. This notifies the teacher that the child has been signed in late at the office.
When collecting your child early please attend the front office to sign your child out on the iPad. We ask that you avoid doing this at recess (11-11.45am) and lunch (2.00-2.40pm) times if possible. If you child is out temporarily, you will need to sign them both out and back in when they return.
