We thank Lisa & Adam Johnstone, who supplied the rugby tops and Buffalo Sports who supplied the shirts. The students are very happy with them!


Playground Markings

Your child may also have a raw food snack at 10.00 am if they are hungry. We encourage nude food to lessen our ecological footprint.

Please note that the junior school children will have 10-15 minutes to eat before they go outside for their recess and lunchtime play break and the senior students will have ten minutes.

Be Sun smart: Apply Sunscreen

During term one and term four, we ask that our children apply sunscreen before they come to school. Each class also has a supply of sunscreen which is reapplied before going out to lunch. Children need also to wear their St Ambrose sunhat when outdoors. Your child may also bring their own sunscreen from home if you prefer a particular brand or if your child has skin allergies. Bushfire Procedures for the Bushfire Season

St. Ambrose Parish School is listed on the 2023-24 BARR and will be required to close on days with a fire danger rating listed as Catastrophic.

The following information will help us plan and prepare our school to support the safety of staff, students, and the wider community.

Assessing bushfire and grassfire risk Schools and early childhood education services are categorised based on their risk of bushfire and grassfire in line with the Victorian Education Facility Bushfire Risk Methodology and review this classification annually. To inform this classification, we have used the Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (CSIRO) analysis informed by the Bushfire Management Overlay, Victorian Fire Risk Register, and terrain and fuel type exposure.


Our school is rated as CAT 3. This means that St. Ambrose Parish School:

• Must close on days forecast as 'Catastrophic' by the Bureau of Meteorology within our designated fire district. Australian Fire Danger Rating System In September 2022, Australia introduced a new fire danger forecasting system, the Australian Fire Danger Rating System (AFDRS). A nationally consistent system will more accurately predict fire danger and produce clear, simple messages for communities. Victoria has been using a 6-tier system for fire danger ratings, from 'Low' or 'Moderate' to 'Code Red'. The AFDRS have replaced the Victorian system this year and uses 4 tiers of fire danger, from 'Moderate' to 'Catastrophic'.

What can parents do?

- Make sure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone numbers. Keep in touch with us by
 reading our newsletters, by checking our website https://www.sawoodend.catholic.edu.au/
 and by talking to your child's teacher or any other member of the teaching staff.
- If your child is old enough, talk to them about bushfires and your family's bushfire survival plan.



RESILIENCE PROJECT...

With only a few weeks left of school in 2023, we at St Ambrose were gifted a surprising opportunity. Jellis Craig, Woodend, has funded for us to participate in The Resilience Project (TRP) Program from Foundation to Year 6 for the entirety of 2024.

Source: Netional Survey of Mental Health and Wellbeing, Australian Institute of Health and Welfare, Australia's Youth: Mental Viness The Resilience Project is committed to **teaching** positive mental health strategies to prevent mental ill-health and build young people's capacity to deal with adversity.

Teachers and students will engage in weekly lessons and activities around the key principles of Gratitude, Empathy, Mindfulness (GEM) and Emotional Literacy to build resilience.

The program has been designed to address multiple curriculum areas and also addresses the first six topics of the Respectful Relationships curriculum. This means we are able to fulfil our goals for Respectful Relationships whilst making the most of what the Resilience Project has to offer.

There will be ample opportunities for families to be involved in the curriculum, at home, with more information and resources to come.

We are in the process of finalising when in the school week each class will complete their TRP lesson. We are also excited to make the links to our Inquiry topic, Wellbeing, for term 1.


