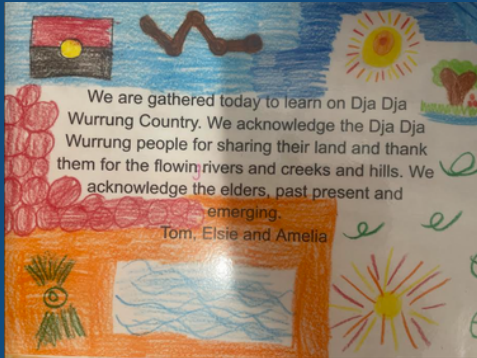




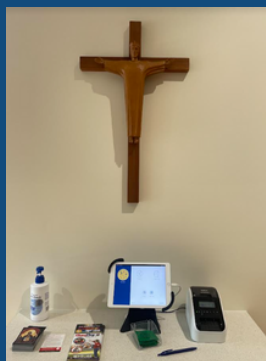

RSL president John McCausland commended all local students who attended the service and thanked their families and schools for supporting the RSL to keep the tradition of Remembrance Day alive.

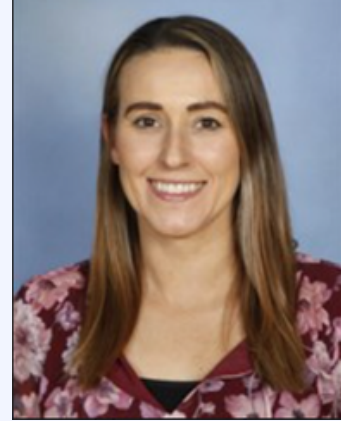

The first day of Advent is the first day of a new Liturgical (or church) calendar and begins a four-week period of preparation for the nativity of Jesus Christ at Christmas. The Advent Season is about reflecting on how we can prepare our hearts and homes for Christ's birth in the world as it is today. School Fees 2024

We take pride in the fact that we are able to achieve excellent educational outcomes for our students whilst providing an affordable Catholic education. In keeping our costs low and affordable, it is essential that families contribute to their child's education by ensuring that payment of the fees and levies is made each year and in a timely manner.

To meet our costs in 2024 we will continue to offer two options for how and when to pay school fees which can be:

1. in agreed installments via direct debit or
2. in total at the beginning of the year.

This assists in ensuring that the school receives funds at the start of the school year so that we can pay the many costs that are invoiced to us in January and February.

For families who are currently in arrears for the 2023 school year and have not made an arrangement with the school, it is essential that you please attend to your account as soon as possible or contact the office prior to next Friday 10th November 2023.

We do everything we can to hold costs down whilst providing the best education opportunities possible for your child. We thank you for your efforts to keep payment of fees up to date. It is important for us to collect fees as these are included in our budget to cover the costs of delivering rich and diverse programs for your children.

We understand that family income and financial situations can change for many reasons and can cause much stress to families and therefore always encourage families to communicate with us, so that individual circumstances can be managed.

For your forward planning, 2024 fees are set as follows:

- **Family fee: \$2,030.00 per family**
- **Student Levy: \$665.00 per student**
- **Gr 3/4 camp \$ TBA**
- **Gr 5/6 camp \$ TBA**

There is an increase of \$60 in the family fee and \$40 in the curriculum fee. This is a 3.9% increase which is within the recommended 5% increase.



Thank you for your efforts to keep your payment of fees up to date. This greatly assists us to meet our costs, update resources, and to continue to deliver quality programs for your children.

Concessional School Fees for Eligible Students

Students of eligible families are entitled to concessional school fees. See Karen at the office to find out more about concessional fees.

We would also like to take this opportunity to thank you for your support of the school in a non-financial way through participation in classroom activities and parent groups, contributing to school projects and works, and assisting with events. Our community, as a whole, has gained greatly from the gift of your time, effort, and support. We look forward to strengthening our partnership with our families in the 2024 school year.

5/6T CLASSROOM FEATURE

This term we have been exploring 'Healthy Minds, Healthy Bodies' for inquiry. We have looked at how the digestive system works and how foods affect us. Earlier on in the term we created a project where we chose a fruit or vegetable and found different information about the category, nutritional value, where it grows and what recipes it can be used in.

Throughout the term we have also been cooking for our families for inquiry homework. We have had a lot of fun preparing and making the meal and then presenting what we have done to the class. Finally, the most fun we have had is the baking at school. We had a Finnish family visiting on Monday, which was lucky for them as we made cupcakes with the grade 1 and 2s. BANANAS



Description

The banana is a tropical fruit from Southeast Asia that takes either yellow or green. The banana has a thick peel with a slightly light yellow flesh inside. The banana is from the musaceae family. Other popular fruits from that family include plantains and cashews.

NUTRITIONAL VALUE

The main component in banana is starch. Some bananas are made of water. The starch that the starch disappears as the banana ripens. And when it's ripe, it's made out of less than 2% starch. But you know you still will taste, sugar, and glucose.

Where it grows



Bananas are grown in Queensland, Northern Territory, and Western Australia. They are also grown in the United States, Central America, and the Caribbean.

Where to buy / Cost

Bananas can be bought in a supermarket or in a fruit and vegetable shop. In Australia, being the 6th most popular fruit in Australia, bananas are the most popular.

Bananas in Australia cost \$3.50 per kg.

Recipes

Bananas are known for their health benefits. They can be made into smoothies, baked into bread, or used in other recipes. Bananas are also used in many other recipes.

Bananas are good for your health and are a great source of energy.



Oranges

Description

The sweet orange is a sweet, seedless orange with 10-12 segments and a sweet tangy flavor. They have a second undeveloped fruit that grows opposite the ones which looks like a belly button which is where it gets its name. It is low in acid. It is from the rutaceae family. This family includes lemons, limes and grapefruit.

Where and how it grows in Australia

The first sweet orange tree was discovered in Brazil in 1520. Sweet oranges are grown in Spain, South America, South Africa, Japan and the USA. In Australia, they are mostly grown in the Murray Valley and the Riverlands of NSW and SA. They are grown by being grafted because they are seedless. There are over 50 varieties.

Nutritional information and health benefits

Sweet oranges have excellent health benefits. They are full of vitamins and minerals. Vitamin C, fibre, potassium, calcium, Vitamin A, beta-carotene and calcium. These help to repair and grow body tissue, lower blood pressure, reduce your risk of heart disease, help control diabetes and prevent cancer. They are also good for your skin, your bones and your eyes. One large sweet orange gives you your total recommended daily intake of Vitamin C.

The cost of sweet oranges and where to buy them

Sweet oranges are in season in Australia from May to November. They are around \$0.70 each, \$2.50 for 3 kilos or \$2.50 for a pack of 6 in the supermarket. They can also be bought in fruit and vegetable shops and farmer's markets where they are a little more expensive.

Recipes that include sweet oranges

Sweet oranges can be used in lots of recipes like orange color, orange yoghurt, orange marmalade and they can be added to salads. They can be dried and used for decoration or grated and squeezed to add flavor to cookies. They can be squeezed to make fresh orange juice.

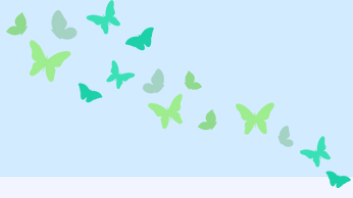
Foods that complement sweet oranges

Foods that go well with sweet oranges include blood oranges, apples, lemons, limes and grapefruit, especially in marmalade. Sweet oranges also go well with being dipped in chocolate and with chocolate brownies. Mungus also go well with oranges.

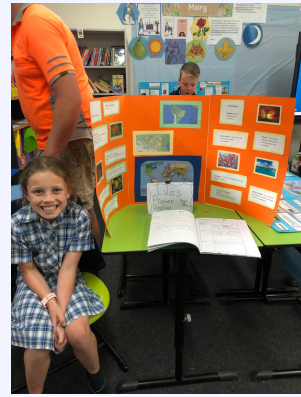
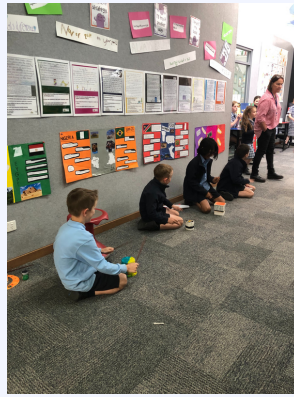
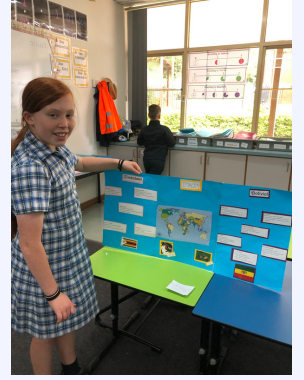


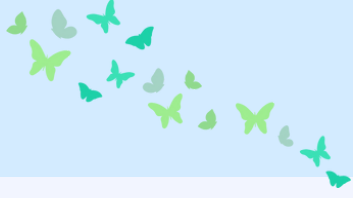
