of our teachers every day! Each year this day is marked internationally to acknowledge teachers all over the world.



Class Groupings 2024

Now that our class structures are in place, our teachers are more closely considering class groupings for 2024. In doing this, academic, social, and emotional considerations are taken into account to inform decisions.

We are fortunate at St. Ambrose to have our teachers plan learning activities together and that also allows our children to mix across the class groupings. Our combined knowledge of your children guides us as we place children in their classes for the coming year.

You may email your child's current teacher, Debbie Geisler, or myself before October 26th, 2023 if there are considerations we need to be aware of that we may not know already.

St. Ambrose Parish School is a Child Safe School called to action through Gospel values. Through the mission of Jesus, we are dedicated to pursuing the fullness of life for all. Indeed, school is a place where children benefit by learning how to relate to all of their peers rather than spending time with only a few favourite friends or children with the same interests and talents. In doing this they learn about

themselves in relationships and identify qualities within others that they find positive and assuring for themselves. It enables them to grow when they experience many varied friendships and children of different learning abilities than their own.

Our step-up day is on Tuesday, December 5th. This is when our students move into their classes for 2024. We will inform you prior to this day of your child's class and teacher for 2024.

Uniform & Footwear





Great work girls!!






Flexischools allergen notice





Mental Health & Wellbeing at St Ambrose

RESILIENCE, RIGHTS & RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS PROGRAM IS COMING IN 2024

We strive to provide our students, in alignment with our Catholic values, with the knowledge, skills and practice in developing their personal and social capabilities as they develop into teens and adults. We want to instill in the students a deep understanding of empathy for themselves and others, a great knowledge of who they are, how to seek help, how to build positive relationships and to understand gender stereotypes as well as what gender equality means.

That is why we are excited to announce that in 2024 and 2025, we will be introducing The Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships (RRRR) program into our classrooms from Prep-6. We will be following in the footsteps of many Catholic schools across the state.

The program is designed sequentially and age appropriately, leading students at all year levels to develop their skills and knowledge in the following areas:

Topic 1: Emotional Literacy
Topic 2: Personal Strengths
Topic 3: Positive Caring
Topic 4: Problem Solving
Topic 5: Stress Management
Topic 6: Help seeking
Topic 7: Gender & Identity
Topic 8: Positive Gender Relations

Topics 7 & 8 focus on building and promoting gender equity in relationships and the challenging of gender stereotypes. When teaching about gender inequality and related issues (such as genderbased violence, delivered age appropriately), students need assistance to understand the difference between the inherent biological differences between males and females (eg. termed differences between the sexes), and learned social and cultural differences (eg. termed gender differences). Children benefit from learning about the ways in which gender norms are created and transmitted. They benefit from critical thinking exercises which demonstrate and challenge the limiting nature of many traditional gender norms, as well as learn to value and show respect for diversity and difference, which aligns beautifully with the teachings of Jesus.

Respectful Relationships is a whole-school approach, recognising that schools are a place of learning, a workplace and a key part of local communities. It will lead us to embed a culture of respect and equality across our entire school community, from our classrooms to staff rooms, sporting fields and social events. This approach leads to positive impacts on students' academic outcomes, their mental health, class behaviour, and relationships between teachers and students.

Studies show that school-based violence prevention and respectful relationships initiatives can make a real difference, producing lasting change in attitudes and behaviours in students. The Department of Education and Training has provided a range of evidence based resources to support teaching and learning about respectful relationships.


