

These appointments are a great way to allow communication between school and home, meet with your child's teacher, and share with them information that will assist them in learning to know your child. These conversations have the purpose of assisting us to hear about your child from you and enable us to work together toward your child's learning and social well-being. If you were unable to book in on the days allocated you can make an alternative date with your child's teacher.

School Improvement - Peer Observations

To empower teachers to be engaged and reflective practitioners our teachers are actively participating in cycles of Performance and Development to improve their teaching and student outcomes.

In order to support this and to develop a whole-school approach to Learning and Teaching we release teachers so that they can observe or model for their peers before engaging in critical colleague conversations. This is one strategy we use to improve our teaching and learning outcomes. Teachers pre-set goals before these sessions and learn from each other in the process. We are also working on establishing a consistent and sequential structure for our reading, writing & numeracy blocks.

Peer observation supports teachers to:

- engage in professional learning to improve teaching.
- enhance students' learning through reflective practice.
- demonstrate leadership by observing and supporting other teachers.
- celebrate excellent teachers and varied skillsets.
- gain feedback on significant teaching or course changes.
- enhance the culture, and form a community around teaching and learning.

As an observer participating in peer observation, you may:

- see teaching practices that they can emulate.
- learn about teaching technologies.
- demonstrate leadership in teaching and learning.
- support colleagues.
- take dedicated time to watch and reflect on teaching.
- gain a student's perspective.
- connect with colleagues in other levels.

Next week a number of our teachers and leadership team will engage in peer observation and modelling best practice sessions. It is fantastic that our staff are all open to continuing to learn and grow as professional practitioners.

1/2CM Number Talks!


We have been exploring lots of number knowledge and understanding in 1/2CM through our daily Number Talks.

Gospel Reflection: Sunday's Gospel: Mark 1:12-15 (18th February - The 1st Sunday of Lent)

Today's Gospel is simple and direct. Jesus tells us what we are called to do to enter into this season: "Repent, and believe in the Gospel." By proclaiming this reading at Mass today, on the first Sunday of this new liturgical season, the Church brings us back to the true reason for Lent, to use these forty days to grow closer to our Lord in His suffering.

Small moments of prayer throughout the day, little sacrifices chosen in the moment, turning toward Jesus as you go about the duties of your family routine - these are all beautiful ways to enter into this season, and to allow Jesus to transform your life.

This Lent, when you are tempted to judge yourself harshly for all that you are not doing, remember the simple message of today's Gospel reading and refocus your energy on doing what our Lord asks, in any small way that you can. An act of repentance doesn't have to be grand to be beautiful.

Just as today's Gospel from Mark tells us that when Jesus returned from his 40 days of sacrifice, danger and temptation in the Wilderness, and he asked the people of Galilee to repent and believe in the Good News that the Kingdom of God is at hand, we here in Woodend, in 2024, are also asked by God for the same thing.

We, as a parish community of believers, understand that this involves a calling to us all, a ministry, to spread the same message and live a conscious life of belief in God and in respecting and helping our Neighbour in this place. We have had a recent calling to assist more in the running of the Parish, as our Priest and Pastor, Father Martin, has experienced some recent health challenges.

A Parish Lay Team has been convened and has met to identify the actions and ministries needed to keep our wonderful parish as a vibrant, working hub of Catholic community and Catholic practice, here and now.

And, after some further discussion, there will soon be an invitation for interested parish members to be a part of this, by a sharing of the gifts and talents of parishioners, to ensure our Parish remains alive, active, welcoming and growing. We will expand more on this, and will be taking inspiration from the Lenten Cospels, during the Masses of the coming weeks.



Be Sun smart: Apply Sunscreen

During term one and term four, we ask that our children apply sunscreen before they come to school. Each class also has a supply of sunscreen which is reapplied before going out to lunch. Children need also to wear their St Ambrose sunhat when outdoors. Your child may also bring their own sunscreen from home if you prefer a particular brand or if your child has skin allergies. Bushfire Procedures for the Bushfire Season

St. Ambrose Parish School is listed on the 2023-24 BARR and will be required to close on days with a fire danger rating listed as Catastrophic.

The following information will help us plan and prepare our school to support the safety of staff, students, and the wider community.

Assessing bushfire and grassfire risk Schools and early childhood education services are categorised based on their risk of bushfire and grassfire in line with the Victorian Education Facility Bushfire Risk Methodology and review this classification annually. To inform this classification, we have used the Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (CSIRO) analysis informed by the Bushfire Management Overlay, Victorian Fire Risk Register, and terrain and fuel type exposure.

Our school is rated as CAT 3. This means that St. Ambrose Parish School:

• Must close on days forecast as 'Catastrophic' by the Bureau of Meteorology within our designated fire district. Australian Fire Danger Rating System In September 2022, Australia introduced a new fire danger forecasting system, the Australian Fire Danger Rating System (AFDRS). A nationally consistent system will more accurately predict fire danger and produce clear, simple messages for communities. Victoria has been using a 6-tier system for fire danger ratings, from 'Low' or 'Moderate' to 'Code Red'. The AFDRS have replaced the Victorian system this year and uses 4 tiers of fire danger, from 'Moderate' to 'Catastrophic'.

What can parents do?

- Make sure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone numbers. Keep in touch with us by reading our newsletters, by checking our website https://www.sawoodend.catholic.edu.au/ and by talking to your child's teacher or any other member of the teaching staff.
- If your child is old enough, talk to them about bushfires and your family's bushfire survival plan. You can access more information about school closures on the Catholic Education Commission of Victoria Ltd (CECV) website.
