
Living Rosary

St Ambrose Diversity & Inclusion Committee (SADI)

What is the SADI?

Earlier this year, working closely with our principal Bronwyn Phillips, a group of St Ambrose parents came together to formalise the Saint Ambrose Diversity and Inclusion Committee (DIINC). A subcommittee of the St Ambrose School Advisory Council (SAC), the SADI draws on the expertise and lived experience of the pre-existing 'inclusion network for parents of Saint Ambrose'

and the work of the SAC in 2022-2023

Our committee aims to benefit each person in our school community including all students, staff, St Ambrose families and our broader community. Acknowledging that a deeper sense of belonging and inclusion for each individual and group, in turn increases the overall wellbeing of the entire community.

We need your help

We're seeking guidance and leadership from school families and individuals who identify as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander. So, if this is you or your family we'd be honoured to hear from you. We are respectful of the enormous work such generous contributions can involve and will take your lead on the amount of time and knowledge you are able to share.

We are working alongside our principal Bronwyn, school leadership, teachers, staff and likeminded groups and individuals in our broader community, to further strengthen the ways in which Saint Ambrose school community members can connect, find information, deepen knowledge and work together in the areas of Inclusion and Diversity. This is a journey of learning which we are all on together.

Next year we'll be further formalising our committee structure and membership and we'd love for more parents and families to become involved and support this work.

Our work

We will work to be responsive to the needs of the students and school families and are mindful of the boundaries of resources and person hours. We work to provide inclusive and varied ways in which everyone can contribute. Thus far we have identified the following objectives, values, approach and areas of priority.

Our objectives

To work alongside students, school leadership, staff and school families:

·to foster a true sense of belonging for all students, staff and school families

·to provide equitable and accessible education for all students at Saint Ambrose

to foster an environment that supports each individual to participate in their best learning journey

Acknowledge and learn from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities

·To amplify the voices of priority groups within our school community including and not limited to Diversity of Culture, Gender, Social and Economic Status, Ability (e.g. Disability, Gifted Ability) and Neurodiversity.

Committee Values include being guided by catholic faith-based values, seeking first nations guidance and leadership and working together towards achieving equity and access in the areas of inclusion and diversity through increasing representation and visibility of members of our community with lived experience.

Priority areas for this term

Establish and strengthen a staff inclusion and diversity support team for students, staff and parents.

- Seek collaboration with local First Nations
 Communities -through Aboriginal identified families in the wider Saint Ambrose community.
- 2. Further development -and enhancement of existing 'safe spaces' within the school and during all special events (onsite and offsite) including development of information and education around accessibility and use of 'safe spaces'.

Medium-term priority areas include

3.Establish a diversity and inclusion parents' support team for new and existing St Ambrose families who wish to learn more about support and resources available in the inclusion and diversity space

4.Development of a St Ambrose online resource hub with links to resources and information about supports, resources and processes available. e.g via the school, MACS, local community etc.

5. Supporting the provision of a collaborative education and workshop series to enrich understanding and increase skills for all students, staff and families in working to enhance inclusion and diversity within our school community

6. Working collaboratively with other like-minded groups within our community





I hope that this can help someone in need who is suffering from cancer.


My hair is also going to be made into a wig that I hope goes to someone who is suffering from cancer and might have needed to do chemotherapy.




