Victorian Premier and former premiers.




Student Initiatives

5/6P Classroom Feature

Dear families

We have had a great start to the term and it has been a hectic three weeks with Cross Country trials, ANZAC Day and an immersive visit to Sovereign Hill. Our inquiry Unit on Migration to Australia investigates the various waves of migration to Australia. We began the unit with the first contact between Indigenous Australians and Europeans with Cook's exploration of the East Coast of Australia. As the term continues we will explore the First Fleet, the Gold Rush, and post-war migration through to refugees from the many war-torn countries in the modern era. Sovereign Hill was a great opportunity for our students to experience the excitement and hardships of life on the goldfields.

These are some comments from some of our students:

'Last week the 5/6s went to Sovereign Hill. It was fun to see how people lived during the gold rush. My favourite bit was when we went underground into the Red Hill Mine and watched how hard the miners worked to find gold.'

'Sovereign Hill was a great place for an excursion. We learned a lot about the gold rush and how people lived We went to places like an old photography shop and a candle dipping shop. Then we went panning for gold, it was so much fun and I got very wet yeah I didn't find any gold. After panning for gold we had our lunch, and then we went to the Red Hill Mine which had hologram projections and sounds of what it would be like in that mine back in the gold rush. Later we went down the Red Hill Mine. It was dark and scary and we saw a miner find the second-biggest nugget ever found in Victoria. I had a great day.'

In Maths, we are using our thinking and problem-solving skills to solve Multiplication and Division problems. In Literacy, we are working on information reports and reading a class novel 'Warhorse' using our comprehension skills to answer questions about the book.

Jesus said to his disciples: I am the true vine
, and my Father is the gardener.



Gospel Reflection: John 15:1-8

The parable of the vine and the branches is one of my favorites. It is one of the most hopeful and uplifting of Jesus' parables. It is so encouraging when one is feeling down and stressed by the busyness of everyday life. We (the branches) are held up by Jesus (our vine). We are attached to Him; He nourishes and supports us. When we are feeling burdened by the responsibilities of home, children, jobs, or life in general, our vine is there to bear some of that burden with us.

Jesus told the disciples that they must "remain in [Him]." Despite the busyness and tiredness, we need to remain in Him by cultivating our relationship with Him. We need to make prayer a daily habit. We must find time to read His Word. Going to Mass to receive Him - body, blood, soul, and divinity will nourish and sustain us. Going to confession to hear His forgiveness will help lift some of that burden. We should consciously work at being closer to Jesus.

Getting back to the parable, we can remain in Him by leaning into Him. We can count on Him. We can meditate on His love and care. He certainly is the vine that holds us up.

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
