Everyone Belongs at St Ambrose



As you know last Friday at St Ambrose we acknowledged 'Bullying No Way' week with a pop of purple! Every day is a day to say no to bullying! This year's theme is 'Everyone Belongs'. Bullying No Way Week is an opportunity to promote the importance of peer, school, parent and community connections – where every child feels safe, supported and respected.

Positive school climates that value diversity and inclusion can foster a sense of belonging and provide a protective factor against negative peer relationships and reduce bullying. Teachers play an important role in supporting

students' sense of belonging. Prioritising high-quality and respectful teacher-student relationships leads to supportive and caring classrooms where everyone is respected and treated fairly. When teachers create a positive learning environment, it helps students feel

like they belong and reduces the occurrence of negative behaviours such as bullying. A podcast recommendation on this topic is - 'Bullying and Belonging' from the Department of Education and

Associate Professor and Educational and
Developmental Psychologist at Monash University
Dr Kelly-Ann Allen. Dr Allen discusses the importance
of belonging in schools and how it can help to prevent
bullying. This podcast is produced on behalf of
Bullying No Way: National week of action -

an initiative of the Australian Schools Anti-Bullying

Collective.

Working together with the school is the best way to help your child resolve bullying issues. We will work with you to resolve the situation and will also work with the other student's parents. Due to privacy law, they will not be able to share information about any other students involved.

5/6P CLASSROOM FEATURE

This term the 5/6s have been investigating Bushfire Preparedness. I have been very pleased with the discussions and learning taking place in the classroom and I look forward to our future collaboration with the CFA. The following paragraphs are a small selection that demonstrates the depth of knowledge of our students on this important topic. This week we also say farewell to Finn who is returning home to the Czech Republic after 7 weeks in 5/6P. The students, Joanna and I have enjoyed having Finn in our classroom. We have learned so much about him and his homeland, we wish him a safe journey home.

Farewell Finn



Over the past six weeks in inquiry the 5\6s have been looking at fire ecology. We learnt about how being aware of bushfires can help you relax in a stressed situation and about how the Macedon Ranges is a fire prone area, it is also in the temperate zone. Did you know that lignotubers are woody bulges at the base of the tree, they connect the trunk to the roots underground just like carrots and green shoots sprout from them after a fire. Also when trees get burnt the trees grow epicormic buds that are basically small stems and make the tree look fuzzy. We are looking forward to our investigation and our exhibition.

Throughout the past 6 weeks we have been learning about bushfire safety. The first thing we learnt about was our safety and how we can help around the house. We also learnt about being aware of bushfire danger and knowing the dangers of how it could affect us. We used google earth to see how far we are away from a bush and Mt Macedon's cross. After we learnt about the temperate zones and how the weather (Climate zones) normally is. We also learnt what we need to take: personal hygiene, food, water, pets, phones, passports and other important things. Then we found out about different types of bushland in Australia such as: rainforests, dry woodland, grassland, Alpine and heath. All up it is very interesting.

In inquiry, we have been learning about bushfire safety and how we can stay calm and be aware during a bushfire. I have learnt about the different vegetation types in Victoria that grow and are bushfire prone, how animals can escape a bushfire and more. Lately, we have been learning about photosynthesis and epicormic growth. The most interesting thing I learned is that when the fire goes through, Mountain Ash trees open their gumnuts and drop their seeds into the ash bed and seedlings sprout.

I am looking forward to the rest of the unit. SOPHIE.

Bushfires: People hear this word and fret about it, but it doesn't have to be that way. So, as a 5/6 unit we've been learning about this topic. Bush fires sound bad, but in reality having small burn offs every now and then is actually good for the forests we have in Australia! Different ecosystems like Woodlands, mallee, and more all need fire to keep re-growing and to keep living in Australia! We are one of the only countries with all the different climate zones, like subtropical and tropical.

In the end, Australia has lots of different flora and fauna to love so appreciate it and love it!

Fire safety

This term our classes have been learning about fire safety in inquiry. We have been looking at fire prone areas, how adaptive traits help trees and animals survive over time and how we can prepare for fire at home by creating emergency bags with vital items. We have also learnt about different types of forests and bushlands like: Rainforest, woodland, grasslands alpine and heath.

Eliiah

This term in inquiry we are learning about bushfire safety. I think being aware of bushfires is a great part of learning. I have learnt so much. One of my favourite things we learnt about this term was; how mountain ash is an obligate seeder which means the seeds are encased in hard capsules called gumnuts that open and drop their seeds after a fire. This allows the seedlings to grow and new life to be made. Another thing I enjoyed was learning about all the zones, and how the temperate zone is the most fire prone. A lot of other things we learnt so far: We live in the temperate zone, torpor in animals like echidnas enables them to survive a bushfire, germination, epicormic growth and ecosystems. I have enjoyed learning about bushfire safety and I am excited to learn more. Phoebe

In inquiry we are learning about fire safety and how to protect us and others around us. We have learned a lot since the program started, like about what plants and vegetation are fire prone: we learned about the mountain ash what I really found interesting was when a mountain ash gets burnt in a fire they drop seeds from the hard capsule called a gumnut then they open at the right time and start growing in the ash bed and start to sprout to new mountain ash trees. Also, did you know that mountain ash is the tallest flowering plant in the world? I love learning about fire safety and I can't wait to

learn more. ELSIE




















Congratulations to all the students on their participating and sportsmanship.




WOODEND COMMUNITY FOOD DRIVE

The Woodend Neighbourhood House first set up a food swap at the end of 2021 with the idea that people could take what they need or leave what they could. Very quickly, demand outstripped supply, so in March 2023, the Woodend Community Food Bank formally opened its doors.

The Food Bank is open Mondays and Thursdays between 12.30pm – 2.30pm in the Undercroft of the Woodend Neighbourhood House. Access is via the gates by the Skate Park, off Margery Crescent.

The service provides food, household and personal hygiene items to those in need. Clients from all walks of life are welcomed by a friendly team of






The Social Justice Team at St Ambrose will be running a Food Drive between Monday 26th August until Monday 9th September. Donations can be made via the boxes in the classrooms, or via the office.

Items in demand include:

- Breakfast cereal
- Tinned items, such as soup, tomatoes, baked beans, vegetables, fruit or fish
- Spreads, such as peanut butter, jam, vegemite, honey
- Jars, such as pasta sauces and stir fry meal bases
- · Beans and legumes, including soup mixes, lentils and chickpeas
- Instant meals and stock powder
- Sauces, including tomato sauce and BBQ sauce
- Rice and pasta
- Tea, coffee and long-life milk
- Biscuits, both sweet and savoury
- Toiletries and sanitary products
- Cleaning items, such as washing up liquid, washing powder, sponges
- Toilet paper and tissues

Donations are also very welcome via the collection bins in Coles and IGA in Woodend and cash donations can be made in person or via bank transfer. Contact the Woodend Neighbourhood House between 9am – 3pm Monday to Friday to donate.


