Message from the Principal

Dear families, parishioners, and friends,

On Monday, August 26th we met as a school and parish community in our renovated library which we have named Gumbuya meaning meeting place to acknowledge our first nations people. This gathering was to officially open and bless our new and renovated spaces at St Ambrose.

As you may already know, our school received a grant of \$3,278,000 from the Victorian State Government to finance a much-needed renovation and to build a further four classrooms. We were honoured to have local MP Mary-Anne Thomas and MACS Executive Director

Dr. Edward Simons attend the opening. Rev Fr John Healy blessed our buildings and numerous guests attended including Sr Virginia and other members of our parish.

It was great to celebrate with you and we are appreciative of the funding we received from the government.

Our talented year 5-6 students set the tone for a joyous event with their clever and vibrant circus extravaganza while Lachie G presented a beautiful account of what he loves about St Ambrose school. It was fitting to have four generations represented in his family, all who have been connected with our great school.

Our upgraded spaces allow the option to gather within the school building as a whole school and as a staff. Gumbuya is also an appealing area to host our families and guests for special events.

We now have our Art/STEM area located back within the school building, additional classrooms with break out areas, our Administration area is more spacious and functional, we have two more meeting rooms, a canteen large enough to use as a kitchen for student cooking, an outdoor classroom, a staff room large enough to cater for our staff, disabled toilet facilities and access, new play areas and the option to open up classrooms.

While St Ambrose (formally Our Lady's) has been registered since 1906, it has been in existence since approximately 1859. St Mary's Mission Kyneton was responsible for the school and the first lay teacher appointed, Mr William Barry is said to have walked from Kyneton to Woodend every day whilst he taught at the school. Numbers fluctuated in the years up until the 80's from 16-50.

The Carmelite nuns were in the school for a short time between 1971-1978 however, the sisters of Mercy took charge of the school in 1906 and have been in the school up until 1990. We have named our main meeting room Mercy and another wellbeing room Carmelite in honour of the sisters.

Originally the school was a homestead named "Blanchewood" located in Brooke St. As numbers grew, a planning permit was granted for the new campus on this site which was completed in 1996. The new school was renamed St Ambrose. St Ambrose was a most influential ecclesiastical figures of his time, a theologian and a statesman who served as the Bishop of Milan. He was a knowledgeable man and a fine orator which earned him the reputation of having smooth as honey lips.

He is the patron saint of bee keepers.

The library space and the additional two classrooms were built in 2010. On August 26th we celebrated the most recent building project here at St Ambrose and we are thrilled with our new and improved facilities.

A project such as this called upon significant contribution and collaboration from a broad and multi skilled group of people. Yes, so much work has been done behind the scenes to create such a fantastic result.

To all involved, planners, architects, builders, advisors, MACS staff, and to our families, staff and students THANKYOU! Your collective contribution has been brought to fruition in our improved facilities.

If you visit our school I am sure that you would agree that the building works have let in the light and offer beautiful, flexible and contemporary areas in which our school community can learn and grow.

Together, within our stunning upgraded school building we enable our vision; centred by faith, in partnership with community, we provide excellence in learning. How privileged we are to work together to embed the MACS Vision For Instruction, lighting the pathway to the full flourishing of our school community.

What is MACSSIS?



Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools Improvement Surveys (MACSSIS) is a suite of internationally validated and research-based survey tools that collect a school communities perceptions.

These surveys create useful perception data from students in

Year 4 to Year 12, teachers and non-teaching staff and families as

invited by schools.

MACSSIS response data is used by your child's school to help inform the **ongoing improvement process** across your child's school.

When is MACSSIS?

NOW!!!

The MACSSIS family survey is open between Monday 2nd September and Friday 20th September.

Once the data creation window closes, schools will be able to access their MACSSIS data. These faster processing times means that schools can learn from their students, families and staff quicker and triangulate MACSSIS with current information about student learning, school processes and current demographic data.

How will students, families and staff access MACSSIS?

Each participating school has a MACSSIS coordinator who will organise access to the school's unique MACSSIS online portal.

Coordinators will work with school leaders to provide time for students to access their survey with teachers on hand for supervision and support. For our students it is important for them to know that MACSSIS is not a test, your school wants to know what you think and what you feel can be improved.

MACSSIS is about a school's individual improvement not appraisal
or school rankings.

MACSSIS is 100% online.Is it secure?

Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) has partnered with ORIMA Research to provide each school with its own safe and private portal. MACSSIS coordinators have been nominated by their Principals to distribute encrypted logins and passwords. All data that is collected in the portal is completely confidential and stored in data warehouses located in Australia. MACSSIS is a click only survey. There are no open-ended questions and it is impossible to identify anyone's responses.

Please note: Each family will have received a unique PIN, via email, so that every family has an opportunity to contribute to our school improvement.



We had 5 bins and a camera to sort the rubbish into the correct conveyor belts and separate it from the drain water. It was an amazing experience and I recommend going if you get the chance.

quality of my thoughts, words, actions and my whole character and behavior? Do I knowingly disobey God's explicit commands, warnings and admonitions? Do I invest so much of my money, time, energies and capacities on what is temporary and worldly but spend very little on what is eternal and heavenly?

Wonderings:

Do I embrace the laws of God or the laws and influences of human beings? What is the Gospel Reflection: Mk 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

Handwashing has always been a big deal in our house. With four of the six of us having immune system disorders, it was a necessity, not to mention I didn't have the time or energy to run around the house scrubbing dirty handprints from appliances and walls. Additionally, the thought of eating food with grimy hands grosses me out.

So, in a small way, I can sympathize with the Pharisees in today's Gospel. They observed Jesus's disciples eating their meals without first washing their hands and were alarmed. Their alarm, however, was for a completely different reason than mine. They weren't really worried about health or being sanitary, they were in search of any tiny thing that would allow them to accuse our Lord and His followers of wrongdoing. In this Scripture passage, the point they chose to pick on was not the griminess of the disciples' hands, but the fact that they were not adhering to Jewish laws for purification. They were fanatic about the laws, not because they wanted to please God in all things, but because they thought it made them better than others.

When the Pharisees try to trap Jesus by questioning the disciples' behavior, our wise and quick-witted Lord has the perfect comeback, quoting the prophet Isaiah, "This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me."

He points out that the Pharisees and others like them brush off God's laws in favor of human laws that often are without meaning or love of God. It's all just for show. Jesus doesn't care about what's outside of us; He cares about what's inside of us. He cares what lies in our hearts and how it affects our love for Him.
