At St Ambrose, we honour his legacy and strive to continue his mission of love, compassion, and service. We extend our heartfelt condolences to all who mourn his passing.


May his soul rest in eternal peace.

Auslan is Back



We are happy to announce that we have resumed our Auslan program. Clare Shannon who has been working alongside an Auslan teacher over the past two years in another school and who is undertaking study in Auslan will teach this subject for the remainder of this year.

Our students will continue their Resilience Project lessons with their class teachers. Year P-2 will have their Auslan lesson on Tuesdays and years 3-6 on Wednesdays.

It has been great to observe our students happily re-engaged with our Auslan program.

Photographing Children at School Events

As part of the MACS community, St Ambrose School follows important guidelines designed to keep our students safe and supported. One of these is our Parent Code of Conduct, (previously shared and accessed on our website or via this link: Parent Guardian Code of Conduct which outlines expectations for all members of our school community. A recent update to this document includes guidelines around photographing children at school events. In line with our Child Safety Standards, parents are now asked to only photograph or film their own child. If you'd like to include other children in any photos or videos, you must first gain consent from their families. We understand this may be a change from past practice, but it reflects best practice for keeping all of our students safe. This will particularly apply to assemblies, sports days, excursions, and camps, where group photography has been common in the past. We kindly ask all families to support this approach and help us maintain a safe and respectful environment for every child. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

Social Media Usage

Please be mindful that children in the primary years are limited under law by the types of social media that they can engage with. We ask you to speak with your children about social media usage at home. If you become aware of any incidents of children using social media inappropriately, please let the school know and do not pass on images or messages to other people. Children sometimes make mistakes which we can work with at school but if these mistakes are shared with other people, then it becomes very difficult to protect young children. To do so is to act outside of the parent code of conduct for our school and we seek your support in assisting with this important matter.

There has been a buzz amongst the students of 5/6 W - Production practise started Auslan is back and the Cobaw sports days are coming up!!! FUN!




INQUIRY





Gospel Reflection: John 20:19-31

Despite his lack of faith, we should be grateful to Thomas, because he was not content to hear from others that Jesus was alive, or merely to see him in the flesh. He wanted to see inside, to touch with his hand the Lord's wounds, the signs of his love. The Gospel calls Thomas Didymus (v. 24), meaning the Twin, and in this he is truly our twin brother. Because for us too, it isn't enough to know that God exists. A God who is risen but remains distant does not fill our lives; an aloof God does not attract us, however just and holy he may be. No, we too need to "see God", to touch him with our hands and to know that he is risen, and risen for us. How can we see him? Like the disciples: through his wounds.






