### **Staff Professional Development**





We highly value the opportunity to engage together as a staff to learn more about ourselves and how we can guide and support our students in the best way we can. Last Thursday and Friday we did just that! On Thursday we had a religious education, compliance and curruculumn focus while on Friday we spent the day learning about neuroscience and how the brain works. 


