Congratulations Sister Virginia Mahony of Woodend –

60th Anniversary of joining the Sisters of Charity
Sister Virginia Mahony rsc, of Woodend, this week
celebrated her 60th Anniversary of joining the Sisters
of Charity, an Order which originated in Ireland,
and from where the initial 5 independent, voluntary,
ecumenical women travelled to Australia in 1838,
to set up the Order in Australia, arriving on
New Year's Eve after 4 months on the ship.
One of this Order of Sisters' main objectives is to
"Contribute to the needs of God's people, pursue
the practice of hospitality "(Romans 12:13).
Over many generations, the Sisters of Charity have
come to be recognised as women who visit,
especially in homes – they became known as

The gift of hospitality comes alive for the giver and the receiver through generosity of heart: an acceptance of one another. And it is not always easy to offer or to accept this gift.

"The Walking Nuns".

Sr Virginia says this:
"currently my life is one big kaleidoscope as I share peoples' lives in their homes. Visiting is forever challenging: a riding of the highs and lows of life. So, when I walk up to a door, I always ask Mary Aikenhead (b. 1787 in Cork, Founder of the Order) to help me "not put my foot in it" during the visit!

Covid put up visiting barriers, so I rang 10 or more people each day to keep connected. Even the most introverted person wants connection to others. Pope Francis had written of the longing, the need for a culture of encounter. Whether we write, phone, drop in, plan a visit or get together or

- whose life will you share today?

event; each encounter is gospel -

My shoes symbolise me approaching doorways/homes. So, here's my creative way round the dilemma!"

Sr Virginia has been a primary school Teacher, a Principal in 4 Schools in Victoria, she established a Grief Centre, via St Vincent's Hospital and Caritas Christi, in Fitzroy.

She has been a Parish Associate in Sydney and in Melbourne, and the last 20 years she has provided inhouse hospitality for people who need a break, for whatever reason. She has been visiting people all her life. She visits homes all dayevery Saturday, especially those with school-age children.

The St Ambrose Parish celebrated Sr Virginia's
60th anniversary with her at last
Sunday's Mass, where she spoke of the challenges
and great joys of her long vocation,
with celebratory 'hospitality of cake and tea'
afterwards, and all the Staff at
St Ambrose School hosted Morning Tea for her, at
the School during the week.


First Eucharist




It was great to see our students and families attend the committment masses and information evening as part of their preparation for this significant sacrament. We are praying for all of the people in our community preparing for their first eucharist.



Gospel Reflection: Luke 12:32-48

This passage reminds us that God wants peace for us and that when we store up God's treasures, we do not need to be afraid, for they are tools with which we can conquer anything.

Reflecting on this passage is also a good way to prioritize our lifestyle and possessions.

I am a collector of everything butterflies.
There was a time in my life when I would purchase almost anything if it had a butterfly on it. As word spread of my obsession,
I began receiving gifts. I cannot even begin to count how many coffee mugs I received because they had a butterfly on them. Through the years, as my faith strengthened, so did my vision of what was around me and what I was putting my time and energy into.

Butterflies are a wonderful thing to be addicted to. However, how many do I actually need to store up? I imagine that when I reach Heaven, God will surround me with every butterfly He has created. Upon this realization, I began purging, and with each butterfly I let go of, I asked God to bless someone else. This removed the fear of surrender and replaced it with a loving gesture.

In releasing these possessions and opening up my life to more of God's treasures, I responded to God's call to action. I stopped allowing the material things of this world to serve me and used them to help others. God will take that and allow it to fulfill His purpose.


