

In complying with Child Safe Standard 1 a school must, at a minimum, ensure:

- 1.1 A child's ability to express their culture and enjoy their cultural rights is encouraged and actively supported.
- 1.2 Strategies are embedded within the organisation which equip all members to acknowledge and appreciate the strengths of Aboriginal culture and understand its importance to the wellbeing and safety of Aboriginal children and young people.
- 1.3 Measures are adopted by the organisation to ensure racism within the organisation is identified, confronted and not tolerated. Any instances of racism are addressed with appropriate consequences.
- 1.4 The organisation actively supports and facilitates participation and inclusion within it by Aboriginal children, young people and their families.
- 1.5 All of the organisation's policies, procedures, systems and processes together create a culturally safe and inclusive environment and meet the needs of Aboriginal children, young people and their families.



Child Safe Standard No 1

Organisations establish a culturally safe environment in which the diverse and unique identities and experiences of Aboriginal children and young people are respected and valued.
This month we have focussed on standard one as a staff. We will revise one standard each month for the remainder of this year. See the parent information flyer later in this newsletter.

Phonics Plus – Building Strong Foundations in Reading



Our F-Year 2 students are engaging in explicit teaching of phonics. This year we are implementing the Phonics Plus program.

Phonics Plus is a comprehensive, evidence-based, and systematic synthetic phonics program developed by the Victorian Department of Education for students from Foundation (Prep) to Grade 2. It is fully aligned with the English Curriculum 2.0 and supports high-quality literacy instruction.

The Phonics Plus Program is a Systematic and Sequential Approach

Daily explicit instruction integrates:

- Decoding and encoding (reading and spelling)
- Handwriting instruction
- Spelling generalisations
- Morphology (understanding word structure)
- Reading fluency development




This holistic approach ensures students build not only accurate word reading skills but also fluency and deeper understanding.

Phonics Plus supports teachers to deliver consistent, high-impact instruction while ensuring every child develops the foundational skills essential for lifelong literacy success.



1-2T CLASSROOM FEATURE




1/2T is off to a flying start!

Spotlight on Child Safe Standard 1

Creating a Culturally Safe Environment for Aboriginal Children

Child Safe Standard 1 relates to children and young people feeling culturally safe, respected, and valued.

What does this look like in a school environment?

- **Celebrating culture:** We include and celebrate Aboriginal culture in our classrooms/events e.g. NAIDOC Week, researching stories to share, inviting guest speakers.
- **Taking a stance:** We lead by example against racism and swiftly respond if it is observed.
- **Working together:** We contact and engage with Aboriginal families and communities to make sure our school is welcoming and inclusive. We ask families what they need to feel supported at our school.
- **Ongoing development:** Our staff receive training and knowledge to better understand and support cultural safety.

How Parents, Carers and Guardians can get involved!

Here's how you can support:

- **Familiarise** yourself with the school's child safety policies and understand how they support student wellbeing.
- **Provide feedback** when you notice something that may impact a child's safety or wellbeing.
- **Support** your child when they express their views and that their opinions are valued and heard.
- **Join in** on school activities, parent committees or forums that promote child safety and wellbeing.

Child Safe Standard 1

"Establish culturally safe environments in which the diverse and unique identities and experiences of Aboriginal children, young people and students are respected and valued"

As Catholic educators, we have a moral, mission-driven and legal responsibility to uphold and actively promote the wellbeing and safety of every student entrusted in our care. Our commitment to the protection of students is enabled in nurturing, respectful and safe communities where the uniqueness and sacred dignity of every young person are celebrated, and they can flourish in their learning and development.

This newsletter series provides an overview of what the Child Safe Standards are, how they are designed to help keep children and young people safe and what school governed by Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) are doing to prioritise and achieve this.

Overview of the Victorian Child Safe Standards

The Victorian Child Safe Standards are a set of 11 minimum requirements that all organisations working with children must meet. These standards are designed to:

- Prevent child abuse and harm
- Make child safety a shared responsibility
- Support the wellbeing of all children, including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and children with disabilities
- Promote the participation and empowerment of children and young people

These standards apply to all school staff, volunteers, contractors, and anyone working with children in schools.

Our Commitment

Our commitment to the protection of students is enabled in nurturing, respectful and safe communities where the uniqueness and sacred dignity of every young person are celebrated, and they can flourish in their learning and development.

This vision is driven by the Gospel message of love, justice and abundance, beautifully reflected in the words of John:

"I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full"
(Jn 10:10)

Note: The term 'Aboriginal' includes Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. It is important to be respectful of how individual children, students, their families and community refer to themselves and use appropriate language when referring to individuals or communities.





Gospel Reflection: Mt 4:1-11

I have heard a couple commentaries on this passage that have stayed with me. The first offers this passage as a practical way for each of us to combat the temptations we experience. Jesus relies on the word of God to refute Satan. Three times He is tempted and three times He responds with "it is written." Jesus knows the power of God's Word - He is God's Word - and we do, too. The Bible is filled with God's Word, and it helps us in our own challenges and temptations. We have the Ten Commandments as a skeleton to hold us up. We have the Beatitudes to offer ways to live. There are all kinds of parables to aid us in understanding what God desires of us. We also have recourse to Him - Jesus, the Living Word - when we need help. We know we can call on Him and He will be there. We know the power of His name. Sometimes that may be all we can muster, but it is sufficient. The name of Jesus has authority and power.

The second commentary compared the three temptations of Jesus in the desert to the Israelites. The Israelites wandered there for forty years. He spent forty days and forty nights there. The Israelites tried the Lord three times and failed. Jesus was tempted three times and was victorious.

Throughout the New Testament, Jesus models for us how to live. He demonstrates compassion, truth, and forgiveness. He expects the same of us. He truly is the fulfillment of the Old Covenant, tying up the loose ends, and bringing us all to salvation.
